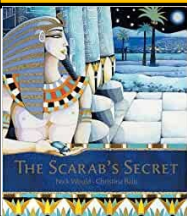
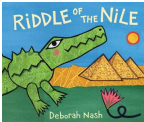

Canopic jars— Special jars that held the organs of a mummy. Hieroglyphics—A type of writing that used a combination of pictures and symbols. Mummification—The process of preserving a body after death in preparation for the afterlife. Pharaoh—The supreme ruler of all of Ancient Egypt. Sarcophagus—A large stone box that held a mummy's coffin.

7500BCE—First settlers in Nile valley 3500BCE—First use of hieroglyphic symbols 3100BCE—Narmer unites regions of Lower and Upper Egypt 2650BCE—First step pyramid build 2550BCE—Pyramids at Giza built 2335BCE—Pyramid texts written (magical spells to protect pharaohs) 1472BCE—Hatshepsut becomes caretaker ruler. (Later declares herself pharaoh) 1336BCE—Tutankhamun becomes pharaoh 196BCE—Rosetta stone carved 1922CE—Carter discovers Tutankhamun's tomb. Narmer—said to be the first Pharaoh of all Egypt Khufu—Pharaoh responsible for building the Great Pyramid of Giza Hatshepsut—First and longest-reigning female Pharaoh Tutankhamun—Youngest Pharaoh, famous for his burial tomb. Ramses II—Ramses the Great, his mummy is still in Cairo's Egyptian Museum. Built more statues and temples than any other pharaoh. Cleopatra—Often considered the last Pharaoh of Egypt.	Moses was a man chosen by God to set the Israelite people free from the Egyptians as slaves   The Ten Commandments were rules given to Moses by God that the people had to follow. Christians and Jewish people still use them today. Passover - The Jewish Festival of God setting the people free from the Egyptians. Lamb's blood was used on the doors, which represented the blood of the Lamb (Christ). Jesus told stories called parables, which He said His followers would understand. Christians still use them today. Miracles were performed by Jesus so that people would understand He is the Son of God. Muslims follow the teachings of Muhammad and believe that Jesus was a prophet, delivering messages from God (Allah)	There are three states of matter: solid, liquid, gas. solid  liquid  gas  Solids will melt into liquids as the molecules start to move faster until they can move over and around each other. Liquids will evaporate into gas when molecules begin moving even faster creating greater space between them. Gas will become liquid again through condensation as the molecules slow down and begin coming together. Liquid will become solid again through freezing as the molecules begin moving very slowly in a single spot close to other particles. Condensation and evaporation both take place in the water cycle.	The Exodus - The Jewish people journeying from the Egyptians and slavery. Pesach—The Jewish festival of Passover Parables of Jesus - A story with a spiritual message. Miracles of Jesus—Healing and acts of wonder. Muslim—a follower of the religion Islam. Prophets—special messengers sent from Allah. Muhammad—The last prophet and the key prophet in Islam. The Qur'an—The holy book of Islam. Solid—a state of matter that holds its shape unless force is applied to it. Liquid—a state of matter that takes the shape of the container it is in but does not change the amount of space it takes up. Gas—a state of matter that spreads out to completely fill the container it is in. Melt—the process of a solid becoming a liquid. Freeze—the process of a liquid changing to a solid. Evaporate—the process of changing from liquid to gas. Condense—the process of changing from gas to liquid.
