| <p>Collage is made up of arranged pieces of materials to create an image<br/>           Artists such as Henri Matisse and Megan Coyle use collage to create their art.</p> <div data-bbox="105 746 291 936" data-label="Image"> </div> <div data-bbox="313 730 546 956" data-label="Image"> </div> <p>Paper can be cut, torn, folded, shaped, overlapped and glued to create an image or design.<br/>           Collage can be used to create landscape pictures.<br/>           Media can be combined to fill shapes and outlines<br/>           Patterns and texture on animals can be created by selecting materials for colour and pattern.<br/>           Art can be created on a small and large scale<br/>           Art can be created individually and in a group</p> | <p><u>Listening/ Composing</u><br/>           A composer is a person who writes music.<br/>           You can use your body to represent movement. For example, you can make your body big or small when a sound is loud or quiet. You can hop and skip to a happy song or glide slowly to a sad song.<br/>           You can create your own music with your voice or an instrument to create a pattern.<br/>           A pattern is a group of notes and rests that repeat.<br/>           When creating music, sounds can be changed<br/>           - high and low (pitch)<br/>           - loud and quiet (volume)<br/>           - fast and slow (tempo)<br/>           - short and long (duration)<br/>           You can change the pitch, volume, tempo or duration of your voice to copy something that you can hear, like a rainstorm or a train journey.<br/>           Camille Saint-Saens was a French composer.<br/>           He composed music called The Carnival of the Animals.<br/> <u>Notation</u><br/>           Symbols can be written down to show you when to play and when to rest.<br/>           A computer programme can be used to create the sound that an instrument can make.<br/>           Music and sounds can be changed on a computer programme.</p> | <p>Some things are living, some are dead, some have never been alive.</p> <p>Most living things live in habitats to which they are suited.</p> <p>Habitats provide the basic needs of different kinds of animal and plants.</p> <p>Microhabitats are homes to a variety of creatures.</p> <p>Animals obtain their food from plants and other animals.</p> | <b>MUSIC</b><br>Composer- a person who writes music<br>Pattern-repeated music<br>Pitch-quality of the sound<br>Volume-how loud or quiet the sound is<br>Tempo-the speed of the music<br>Duration -amount of time                                                                                                                                                    |
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
