Town: An area of streets, houses and building that is larger than a village but smaller than a city. Village: An area of streets, houses and buildings that is smaller than a town. Valley: An area of low land between mountains or hills. Ocean: One of the five major areas of salt water covering most of the Earth. River: A large natural stream of water following towards a lake, sea or ocean. History: In the past. Time: Measuring a period with a beginning and an end. Order: Arranged in time. Chronological: The order in which things happened. Younger: At an early stage in time. Older: At a later stage in time. Before: In the past. After: Later in time. Past: Something that has happened. Present: Something that is happening. Future: Something that will happen.
